

Deutsches Nationaltheater Weimar (German National Theatre Weimar)

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1. Directions and Arrival

You can reach us by **bus**. Take lines 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9 to the “Weimar, Goetheplatz/Zentrum” stop. From there, it's a 240-meter walk.

Walk straight ahead on the left side of the street until you see Back Factory and Telekom. Turn onto “Wielandstraße” and continue straight ahead until you reach a large square. The DNT is located behind the monument of Goethe and Schiller in the centre of the square.

We are accessible by **car**. There are parking spaces open 24/7, including spaces for people with disabilities. The „Schillerkaufhaus“ underground parking garage is 240 meters away. It costs €2 per hour. Card payments are accepted. The parking garage at the „Hauptpost“ is 350 meters away. It costs €2 per hour. Only cash payments are accepted.

2. Accessibility of Ground and Building

The path from the bus stop is paved. The main entrance to the DNT has six steps. You can enter the building from the front via the steps (Figure 2). You can enter the building from the left and right via steps with handrails (Figure 3). There are three further steps inside. There are handrails on both sides of the staircase (Figure 6). The next room contains cloakrooms and the entrance to the stalls of the “Großes Haus” (Main Theatre). Stairs leading upwards take you to the gallery of the “Großes Haus”, the “Foyer” and the “Studiobühne” (Studio Stage).

You can enter the building via a wheelchair-accessible entrance. It is located on the right-hand side of the building. The entrance is through the brown door with the wheelchair symbol (Figure 4 and Figure 5). DNT staff will meet you there. There is a platform lift inside. It provides access to the cloakroom and the entrance to the stalls of the “Großes Haus”. The upper circle of the “Großes Haus”, the “Foyer” and the “Studiobühne” are not accessible by wheelchair. There are only stairs.

There are accessible toilets.
